RETIREMENT ALERT- JOHN KAMENSKY: John Kamensky completed a 44-year career focused on government improvement. At GAO, he helped draft GPRA in 1993. He was a deputy director for the Clinton-Gore Reinventing Government effort, proposing the designation of agency chief operating officers and the President's Management Council. In his 20 years at the IBM Center, he led research on collaborative networks, performance improvement, and strategic foresight. Retirement plans include not setting an alarm clock or attending Zoom meetings during lunch. OMB CIRCULAR A-11 REINSTATEMENT: On March 24, 2021, the White House reinstated OMB Circular No. A-11. This very important section containing important foresight references was removed in December 2020. The document will once again have federal agencies create and track performance goals that reflect the current administration's objectives. (POC: FFCOI)
