REPORT: STRATEGY MAPPING- IBM: The IBM Center for The Business of Government has released a new report on the value and uses of strategy mapping. Strategy mapping is a boundary-crossing process designed to create direction, alignment, and commitment across agencies and among independent organizations at the scale of the challenge or issue to be addressed. It is a technique for creating shared meaning through participation and dialogue and helps users visualize the cause-and-effect chains in a system and the actions needed to change the system. It can be seen as a useful bridge between strategic foresight and strategic planning. (POC: John Bryson)

Is ChatGPT capable of performing the job of a strategic foresight practitioner? After taking ChatGPT on a test run, the short answer is no (at least not yet), but it can be helpful. So how might foresight practitioners use ChatGPT in their work going forward many options to consider such as: driver analysis, scenario development, and identification of opportunities and threats.
